If you need transport to an appointment, just call the Co-ordinator who will try to arrange a lift. This is a registered Charity supported by your local Parish Councils. Fares are calculated on the miles per journey, so for example Brewood to New Cross is 18 miles and would cost £10.

Alternatively, you may have a few hours to spare with your transport, so you could Volunteer! How involved you become is **your choice!**

Wheaton Aston Surgery

Wheaton Aston Surgery is undergoing work to improve patient flow and access. Extension and other work is expected to be complete within the next few months, and meanwhile it is still open and providing services to patients.

How is it best to contact the surgery?

When telephoning for non-urgent matters, patients are advised to avoid Mondays and other days between 8.00 and 10.00am, because these are very busy periods.

Staff levels have increased significantly, and it is hoped that this will improve access in the face of unprecedented demand.

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Do you have access to a computer?

There's a wealth of information freely available on the website concerning minor ailments, health information and a search facility on symptoms.

You can also join Patient Access, which will enable you to place repeat prescriptions and choose to which pharmacy you want that prescription sent. You can also make a doctor's appointment (but not an appointment for nurse or blood tests), see what meds you have had in the past and access your medical records.

To access this service, you need to take photographic identification to reception, and you will be given some codes which you use to set up your account. It <u>IS</u> easier than you may think!

With regard to making a complaint, we have been told by the surgery:- "If a patient feels a formal complaint is needed in writing, we would advise them to email it to brewoodsurgery@nhs.net and it will be forwarded to the most appropriate person to deal with the complaint".

Seeing practitioners specialising in certain fields gives you more expert advice on your condition.
